Background


The Ramaciotti Regional and Remote Health Sciences Training Centre (Menzies-Ramaciotti Centre) is developing a sustainable, local, and First Nations health workforce in the Northern Territory. The Centre facilitates training and career progression for Territory youth with a focus on First Nations youth. The Centre is guided by overarching values of equity, reciprocity, self-determination, mutual support and trust.

About the opportunity

The Ramaciotti Futures Internship Program will support First Nations youth residing in the Northern Territory enrolled in eligible courses for 12 months. Eligible courses include, but are not limited to:

Successful applicants will receive a living stipend of up to \$20,000 per year, paid fortnightly. The final value will depend on the recipient's employment income and access to government income support such as ABSTUDY. Stipends will be awarded through a competitive application process.

The program will run at Menzies School of Health Research in Darwin, Northern Territory, and successful applicants will be expected to regularly attend the Menzies-Ramaciotti Centre in Darwin to gain industry experience, receive training and experience from expert health professionals, and receive peer-to-peer support in their studies. The Menzies-Ramaciotti Centre offers continued support through future study and work.

Eligibility

- This opportunity is for First Nations youth resident in the Northern Territory
- Aged 18 24 years (preferred) and able to enrol in an accredited VET or university course.
- Able to conduct their internship at Menzies School of Health Research in Darwin NT (Royal Darwin Hospital Campus).
- Students already enrolled are welcome to apply

Application requirements

The application must demonstrate a commitment and interest in a career in health and/or science. Each application must include:

- CV outlining studies and any employment or extracurricular activities
- Completed application form
