MENZIES HEALTHLAB HEADS TO BOWALI VISITOR CENTRE

The Jabiru community is reminded that the Menzies HealthLAB will be at the Bowali Visitor Centre on Wednesday, August 16 as part of National Science Week 2017.

Menzies' mobile HealthLAB uses the latest health technology to measure participants' health and inform them about the impacts of smoking, alcohol misuse and diet, which can increase the risk of major chronic diseases such as diabetes, cancer, kidney disease, obesity and cardiovascular disease.

With the assistance of a team of health professionals and scientists, HealthLAB challenges participants to become experts in their own health and demonstrates how lifestyle choices can impact their future health.

All stations are facilitated by trained staff, including dieticians, doctors, nurses, scientists and trained students, who give participants the opportunity of an individual experience.

The stations include:

- Blood pressure- discuss healthy lifestyle choices related to exercise and diet
- Haemoglobin levels discuss healthy diet and its importance to health
- Grip strength an activity which measures upper body strength
- Bio Impedance machine which measures fat/muscle/bone ratios

- Smokerlyser which measures smoke exposure to individuals including smokers
- Ultra sound machine an opportunity for participants to see the inner workings of their bodies looking at organs and blood flow.

The free event will take place from 1pm to 4pm at Bowali and it is open to the public.

KAKADU'S SITE OF AUSTRALIA'S EARLIEST HOME

A team of archaeologists and dating specialists have new proof that Aboriginal people have been in Australia for at least 65,000 years — much longer than the 47,000 years believed by some archaeologists.

The site where this new evidence has been found is Madjedbebe, located on the traditional lands of the Mirarr people surrounded by Kakadu National Park.

The site is located on Aboriginal land excluded from Kakadu National Park as a result of the Jabiluka uranium mining lease granted in 1982.

The lease is now held by Energy Resources of Australia, which partnered with the Gundjeihmi Corporation to provide access to the site.

Madjedbebe rock shelter has been excavated four times since the 1970s, most recently in 2012 and 2015 by an international team led by Associate Professor Chris Clarkson — an Australian Research Council (ARC) Future Fellow at the University of Queensland – in partnership with the Mirarr Traditional Owners. Α landmark agreement with the Gundjeihmi Aboriginal Corporation (GAC) made it possible for Professor Clarkson and colleagues to dig the site in 2012 and 2015.

Dating carried out by Professor Zenobia Jacobs, an ARC Future Fellow at the University of Wollongong, has revealed that Aboriginal people lived at Madjedbebe at the same time as now extinct

species of giant animals were roaming around.

In addition to showing the deep antiquity of Aboriginal occupation, the dig also revealed new evidence of activities and lifestyle. "The site contains the oldest groundedge stone axe technology in the world, the oldest known seed grinding tools in Australia and evidence of finely made stone points which may have served as spear tips", said Professor Chris Clarkson, lead author of the Nature article.

"Most striking of all in a region known for its spectacular rock art are the huge quantities of ground ochre and evidence of ochre processing found at the site, from the older layer continuing through to the present," Professor Clarkson concluded. "This study confirms the sophistication of the Australian Aboriginal toolkit and underscores the universal importance of the Jabiluka area. These findings reinforce the

need for the highest level of conservation and protection for this site," said Justin O'Brien, CEO Gundjeihmi Aboriginal Corporation.

PUSH TO UPGRADE LOCAL TOURISM INFRASTRUCTURE

Minister for Corporate and Information Services Lauren Moss visited Canberra for a range of meetings with Federal Government Ministers and Senators recently.

Minister Moss used the visit to put the case for more Federal Government investment in telecommunications in remote and regional Territory communities as well as tourism infrastructure.

Minister Moss also met with the Federal Minister for Trade, Tourism and Investment Steve Ciobo to again press for Federal Government investment to upgrade tourism infrastructure in Kakadu.

"Enhancing tourist facilities in Kakadu will provide a significant economic boost.."

"While the natural wonders in the park are as stunning as ever, the tourist infrastructure is in need of upgrade - this is about making the park more accessible to more people for longer which will create local jobs," she said.

"Enhancing tourist facilities in Kakadu will provide a significant economic boost to Top End tourism operators who are a key cornerstone of our economy.

"Kakadu is a Federal Government Park and an important tourism asset in the Territory. Tourism operators tell us that sealing roads to key attractions, like Gunlom and Jim Jim Falls, would extend the tourist season and attract more visitors to the park."

The Minister will meet with Fiona Nash, Minister for Regional Development and Minister for Local Government and Territories, to discuss regional and remote telecommunications.

"All Territorians are entitled to access to high quality services. Investment in telecommunications will create jobs and economic opportunities and improve access to health and education services," Minister Moss said.

"I will be talking to Minister Nash about the importance of ensuring regional and remote Territorians have the same access to services as other Australians.

"I'll be updating her on the \$30 million co-investment program that the Territory Government is rolling out with Telstra, a program that is ensuring some of our most remote communities have access to mobile and broadband services.

"The Federal Government has committed to developing Northern Australia and to Closing the Gap on Aboriginal Australian disadvantage – investment in telecommunications is integral to achieving both of these."

NIGHT PATROL TEAMS UNDERTAKE TRAINING

The aim of the training was to review both council and night patrol policies and to develop competencies order to equip team leaders and safety officers with the knowledge and skills required for them to effectively perform their duties.

Guest speakers at the workshop included West Arnhem Regional Council Chief Executive Officer Brian Hylands, Police and Team Health. There was also a presentation of certificates to staff who are now qualified in Certificate III Night Patrol Operations.

Certificate presentations were awarded to Minjilang Night Patrol Team Leader Tapoteisi Tapera Gunbalanya Night Patrol Safety Officer Marietta Nayinggul. There is a total of five staff who qualified late last year in Certificate III Night Patrol Operations facilitated by Charles Darwin University and there are a further 11 staff to begin their Certificate III training with the first block beginning August 28, in Jabiru.

From the Diaries of Flemming Jensen 1968-1969

The last time in Darwin

Allan and I did not get off to Nourlangie this Friday as we had agreed and we did not get off to Alice Springs. All together there was not much of what we had agreed that came true.

Another three weeks passed before I left Darwin and in the mean time I got the chance to get the experience on how to live and work in Darwin. I had incredible hospitality from Allan's friends Ted and Margaret O'Keefe with whom I lived for three weeks in their home in Nightcliff. The way I was treated made me feel that I was a son of the house and was treated just like that. But I could not help feeling restless and uncertain. All the time hesitant and doubtful about when and whether Allan would pay the agreed money so I could get on. And on the other hand I would

And on the other hand I would not travel without getting settled with Allan as I believed that I would ever get my money when I first

left Darwin.

It was pretty frustrating and as time went on, I got more and more bad conscience about just walking around and waiting. For that reason I got a job for a short period as a bricklayer by a contractor.

To be a bricklayer in Darwin you work for ten hours and preferably more a day and at this time of year it is a hard job. Especially for me who has not been accustomed to hard physical work for a long time and certainly not on a construction site.

The heat was almost unbearable and if it was not because of circumstances and my bad economic situation, I would prefer to live without this experience. On the other hand it gave me the possibility to get the experience on my own body and how hard it is to work as a construction worker in Darwin. Largely the days went by working, drinking, eating and sleeping. But then something came up.

nearly three succeeded. Ór nearly! I got the two hundred and twenty five dollars from Allan and he promised to send the rest one hundred and twenty five dollars within the next three weeks. Previously I had got fifty dollars. I had no great confidence that we would become much closer and I was prepared to continue. I have for a long time been hoping that something would happen and now the time had come. 'A big country was waiting and now it could not go fast enough to get on my way.

I had a proper goodbye and farewell party with Ted and Margaret who had helped me all the way and gave me tremendous support. We exchanged addresses and for some years we kept in touch. They later moved to Adelaide where they in their late age had the great joy of being parents to their daughter Lucy.


the SIA over the last six months including Traditional Owners, Jabiru households, representatives of the residents of the Kakadu National Park outstations, and local business and organisations.
